

Neither do I condemn you, go and from now on sin no more. (John 8:11)

It is interesting how an experience or an event can provide an opportunity of insight which absorbs your focus and expression. I find in the midst of our life together at Wangen Prairie certain Scripture passages will become a reoccurring theme of expression. Towards the end of the summer the 'Parable of the Sower' (Mt 13, Mark 4 & Luke 8) became a common resource guiding the sermon time. Preparing the soil, sharing the Gospel, being aware of various toxic influences which corrupt opportunities to grow and flourish, echoed throughout our worship together.

In October, the John 8 text of the woman caught in adultery, became a passage of reflection and insight for my journey and expression of faith. At the beginning of the month, I had the opportunity to attend the LCMC National gathering at Hosanna Lutheran in Lakeville, MN. The theme of the event was Discipleship. We had 3 Keynote speakers sharing various insights on the understandings, practices and challenges of being a disciple in today's context. The third speaker's theme was on obstacles to discipleship. He focused on the perception of Christians being easily offended and hypocritical. He used a personal experience of when a neighbor sinned against him by stealing some of his property and attempting to sell the property at a garage sale a week later. Throughout his speech I found myself reflecting on the John 8 story when the Pharisees and scribes brought a woman caught in the act of adultery to Jesus. They wanted Jesus to respond to the Law which calls for the woman to be stoned. Jesus responds by affirming the presence of sin and called on anyone without sin to throw the first stone. Beginning with the older ones they walked away without throwing their stones. *Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."* (John 8:10-11)

The Keynote speaker did a great job reminding us to not be a Pharisee or scribe, yet he provided little in how to reflect Jesus. All I could gather was that he stopped having contempt for his neighbor. There is more to being a Christian than a changed mindset. There is love. *My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you.* (John 15:12) Jesus' act of love to the woman caught in adultery was to call her to no longer be a slave to sin. Later on in John 8, Jesus reminds us that being a slave to sin will separate one from God. Freedom from this slavery is found in Jesus. *If the Son sets you free you will be free indeed.* (v.36)

How are we to proclaim: Sin is present. I do not condemn you. Go and sin no more? At the end of October, I was hoping to have my opportunity to follow through on this faith expression. Someone contacted me wondering if our church had a benevolence fund to support people struggling to make ends meet. I said yes, we have a 'Helping Hands Fund.' As this opportunity to give played out, it became very obvious that it was a scam. It was a very elaborate fraud with multiple phone numbers, participants, a convincing cover story and a fake address. Finally, I had one of the participants on the phone. I was excited to share, this is a scam, I do not condemn you, do you want to know Jesus who can free you from sin's grip. I only got to this is a scam and then they hung up.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, may His loving embrace give you the strength to be free from sin and call others to this freedom.


